This 1979 APBA project replayed the schedule of the California Angels in each of Nolan Ryan's 34 Appearances that year.

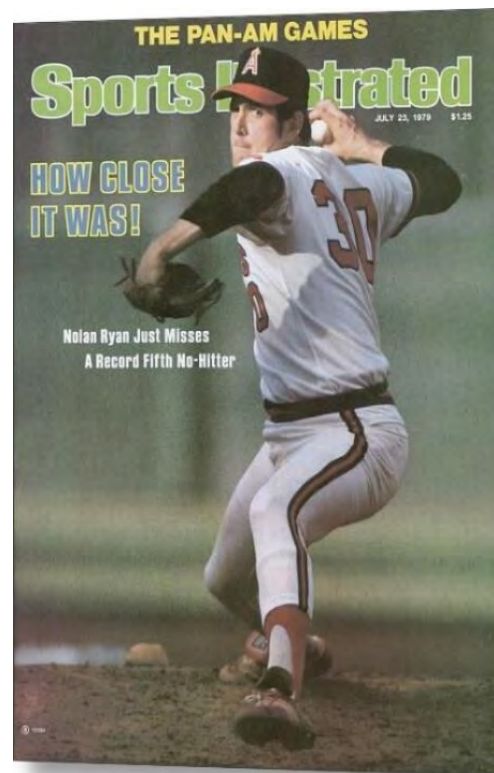
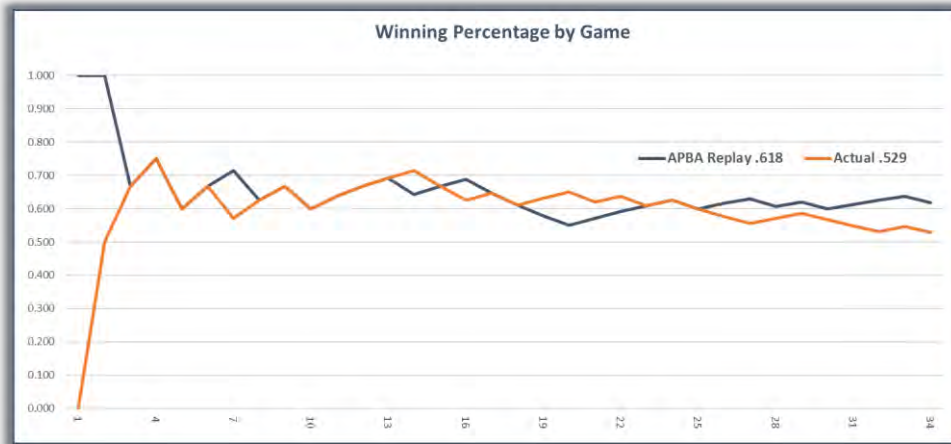
The California Angels won three (3) more games in the replay compared to actual play. The Angels played four teams identically in the replay.

Fifty percent (50%) of the replay games matched the actual win/loss outcome. The Standard Deviation of Wins in the replay versus actual play against opponents was 0.87.

Angel team batting average was .291 in the replay versus .270 in actual play.

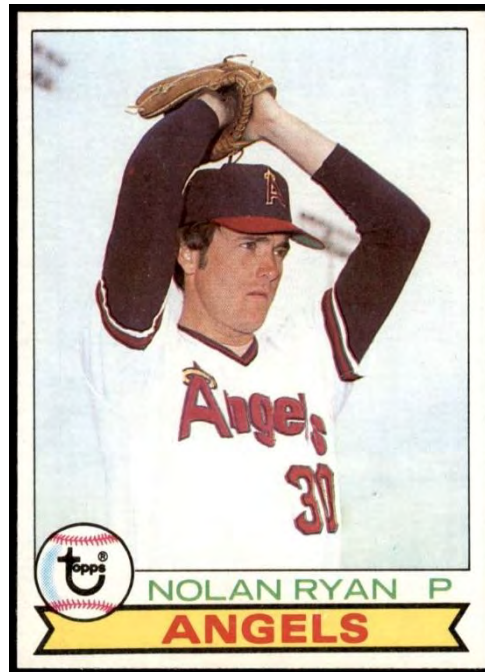
